Atlantic City Public Schools Launches Nation's First District-Wide Esports Program

Towards the end of last month, Atlantic City Public Schools celebrated a groundbreaking achievement with the official ribbon-cutting ceremony

for the district's newest initiative—a bold endeavor that blends technology, career readiness and student engagement. On Friday, Oct. 17, 2025, the district formally launched the first district-wide esports program in the nation during a special event held inside the new esports lab at Atlantic City High School.

Esports—organized, competitive gaming—has grown from a niche hobby into a global powerhouse featuring professional leagues, international audiences and significant scholarship and career opportunities. Recognizing its potential, the district has embraced esports as a pathway to prepare students for emerging industries.

"This initiative is about more than just playing video games," said Superintendent of Schools Dr. La'Quetta S. Small. "The esports program presents an opportunity for students to develop communication, leadership and technical skills—and to explore real-world career pathways in a growing global industry."

The launch was made possible through a strong collaborative partnership with Esports Integration by Horizon AVL, EDGE Consulting, and Bluum, all of whom supported the district in transforming this vision into reality. The ceremony brought together students, staff, college esports representatives and community leaders to celebrate the debut of the custom-designed esports facilities now established in 10 schools across the district.

Each school's esports room was intentionally crafted as a career development hub, giving students access to industry-standard tools and curriculum connected to fields such as game design, broadcasting, marketing, event production and cybersecurity. The program is integrated into after-school and STEM sessions through Platform1, a learning management system developed by Esports Integration and EDGE that supports project-based learning and academic enrichment.



Serving as emcee for the ceremony, Director of Assessment and Special Projects Michael Bird highlighted how the program positions students for future success. The ribbon cutting not only marked the opening of state-of-the-art facilities, but also the beginning of new opportunities for Atlantic City students to explore, compete, create and thrive in a rapidly expanding global field.
