As we prepare for the first day of school, there are several things that must be shared to ensure a safe and productive school year.



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### First Day of School:

The first day of school for students is Tuesday, September 6, 2022. The first two days are early dismissal days. Students will follow the half-day schedule, and students will be dismissed at 12:15 pm.

### Schedule & Calendar

Beginning September 8, 2022, students will follow the full-day schedule. We will utilize the rotating block bell schedule. Students will be permitted in the school building at 7:15 am, and the homeroom bell will ring at 7:40 am. Please encourage your student to both arrive at school and report to each class on time.

### Attendance:

Frequent absences from regular classroom-learning experiences disrupt the continuity of the instructional process. Students will be held accountable for all unexcused absences. The high school guidance counselors and chronic absenteeism team will become involved when students incur chronic unexcused absences.

- 1. Students are required to bring in documentation of absences from a parent/guardian, doctor (medical), funeral home, court, or other institutions to the Guidance secretary.
- 2. When a student has acquired between 11 to 20 unexcused absences, the student will be required to attend credit completion to satisfy the attendance requirement of the class or classes involved. If a student does not attend credit completion, they will be at a loss of credit status.
- 3. When a student has acquired 21 or more unexcused absences, the student will be at a loss of credit status.
- 4. When a student is late three times it will count as an unexcused absence.

\*\*\*When a student acquires a total of 35 excused or unexcused absences, the student will be at a loss of credit status. \*\*\*

### **Dress Code Policy:**

**General Rules** 



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- Students are expected to be clean and well-groomed in their appearance
- Students are expected to avoid extremes in appearance that are disruptive or distracting that the reaction of other pupils is beyond normal control
- Dress or grooming that jeopardizes the health or safety of the pupil or of other pupils • or is injurious to school property will not be tolerated

### Inappropriate Content for Clothing

- Obscenities or vulgarities in words or pictures
- Drug, alcohol, or gang-related references
- Harassing or biased words or pictures related to race, religion, gender, national origin, • or sexual orientation
- Undergarments should not be visible (boxer shorts, bras, panties, etc.) •
- Pajama tops and/or bottoms, sleep bottoms, and/or slippers •
- Midriffs (abdomens or lower backs) should not be visible •
- Cleavage should not be visible •
- Tube tops, halter tops, and single-strap tops are not permitted •
- Spaghetti strap tops can only be worn with another shirt over them
- Shirts that are sheer and/or expose the torso (without another shirt worn under them) • are not to be worn
- Extremely short tops, shorts, or skirts are not allowed; appropriate shorts and skirts are • at least fingertip length when arms are straight down at the student's side
- Ripped jeans with rips above the knee are not permitted
- Extremely tight/form-fitting articles of clothing are not to be worn (spandex, lycra, • etc.)
- Articles of clothing with tears, rips, or slits that expose skin not normally visible under • the other guidelines of this dress code are not allowed
- Hats, hoods, and head coverings are not to be worn in the building
- Hats promoting sex, drugs, racial slurs, and ethnic intimidations, alcohol, tobacco, • profanity, and violence are always prohibited
- Offensive or insulting haircuts are not permitted
- Bandanas, wave caps, and "do-rags" are not permitted

Note: Religious beliefs may require students to cover their heads

#### Smoking, Vaping, Dabbing and Use of Tobacco or Marijuana:

The use of electronic smoking devices is not permitted on school grounds. Any student seen smoking, vaping, or selling tobacco or drugs of any kind will be subject to disciplinary action.

In addition, any student that appears to be under the influence will result in a mandatory medical examination, a drug and alcohol screening, and medical clearance before returning to school.



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### Parent Portal Access

This is a web-based system that grants a parent/guardian immediate access to their child's records. The information that is available on your child includes daily attendance, course schedule, class attendance, interim reports, and grades. The system also provides the parent/guardian with the ability to contact their child's teacher(s) through email. All parents/guardians of newly registered students will be mailed their log-in information To access the system:

- 3. Upon logging in, your child's picture will appear; underneath their picture is a menu on the left will give you information pertaining to your child.
