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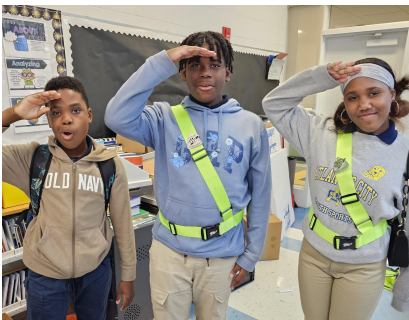
SAFETY PATROL

INGREDIENTS:

Whole Pumpkin
¼ Teaspoon Salt
¼ Cup Olive Oil

STEPS

Preheat oven to 350 degrees
Remove the guts from the pumpkin
Separate the seeds and
pat dry with paper towel
Arrange on a baking sheet
in single layer
Drizzle with olive oil
and season with salt
Add seasonings of your choice
Bake for 20-30 mins or
until golden brown
Enjoy!
