WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:11-12 (p), the District Board of Education is required to establish a maximum travel expenditure amount for the budget year that may not be exceeded; and

WHEREAS, the District Board of Education has determined that the maximum travel expenditure amount will include all travel that is supported by federal, state, and local funds; and

WHEREAS, the District Board of Education has determined that the total maximum travel budget for the general fund for the 2019/2020 school year is \$87,450 and the District has spent \$53,370 as of March 19, 2020,

WHEREAS, the District Board of Education has determined the maximum travel budget for Federal Funds to be \$75,000 for the 2019/2020 school year. The projected travel amount is projected to be the same for the 2020/2021 school year.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Board of Education hereby establishes the maximum travel amount for the 2020/2021 general fund budget is \$87,450.

3. Approve the following:

Whereas, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-14.1 permit a Board of Education to establish and/or deposit into certain reserve accounts in the annual general fund budget certified taxes, and

Whereas, the Atlantic City Board of Education wishes to deposit funds into a Capital Reserve account, and

Now therefore be it resolved the Atlantic City Board of Education has determined that an amount not to exceed \$5,000,000 to be deposited into the Capital Reserve account.
