Budget Presentation – School Business Administrator Mrs. Celeste Ricketts discussed the 2021/2022 budget, the four years of audited financials with no findings, S&P's Global rating upgrading the District to BBB, reduction in expenditures, better monitoring, the refunding of 2011 bonds with of savings of \$7.1M, local tax levy, debt service, pilot funding, state aid, tuition revenue, the total budget 2021/2022 budget of \$224,424,821, reduction in enrollment, raising student achievement, addressing chronic absenteeism, recruitment for ACHS, capital projects, equipment and vehicle purchases and fund balance recap. The carry-over from the 2019/2020 school year were used in the 2021/2022 school year. Mr. Herbert asked about the \$5M for the administration building and the goal to stop renting. Mr. Herbert also inquired about an email of specs and requirements for an administration building.

Public Discussion – Ms. Janelle Edwards-Stewart advised she and Mr. James Mottola are working on a legal matter and would like to be afforded the opportunity to speak with the Board. Mr. Steele advised they may speak at the May 23, 2021 board meeting. Mr. Matthew DeJulio Descino inquired about the \$3,222 spent on the Dr. MLK Roof, asked where the money came from and who did the appraisal. Mr. Descino was advised Mr. Rose and Mr. Austin met with th3e Districts architect.
